VA Benefits in Brief







Overview of Compensation Program

- <u>Purpose</u>: Provide compensation for *disabilities* incurred in, or aggravated by, military service (38 U.S.C. § 1110)
- Benefits based on scale from 10 to 100%
- Tax-free
- Special Monthly Compensation higher levels of disability
- Range of monthly payments (for single Veteran)
 - \$142.29 (10% disabling)
 - \$3,106.04 (100% disabling)
 - \$8,889.08 for Special Monthly Compensation "R2" level (highest level of disability, i.e., loss of multiple limbs)

Current


- Pending Claims 481,106
 - Backlog: 201,493
- Average days to complete (ADC) 108 days
- Accuracy 12-month Issue Level 96%

FY 2020 Performance

- ADC 93 days
- # Claims completed 1.4 million

Service Connection

- Three components to prove "direct" service connection
 - Current Disability
 - Event, injury, or disease in service, and
 - Link between current disability and service
- Presumptions lessen the burden to prove service connection
 - "Presumption of Exposure" satisfies required event in service.
 - For example, VA presumes exposure to Agent Orange if Veteran served in Vietnam
 - "Presumption of Service Connection" satisfies link between current disability and event in service
 - For example, if a Vietnam Veteran has prostate cancer,
 VA presumes condition is related to service in Vietnam





Agent Orange Presumptions

14 Presumptive Health Conditions for Agent Orange Exposure

- AL amyloidosis
- Chloracne or other acne-form disease consistent with chloracne
- Type II Diabetes (also known as Type II diabetes mellitus or adult-onset diabetes)
- Hodgkin lymphoma, formerly known as Hodgkin's disease
- All Chronic B-Cell Leukemias (including, but not limited to, hairy-cell leukemia and chronic lymphocytic leukemia)
- Multiple myeloma

- Non-Hodgkin lymphoma
- Early-onset peripheral neuropathy
- Porphyria cutanea tarda
- Prostate Cancer
- Respiratory cancers (cancer of the lung, bronchus, larynx, or trachea)
- Soft-tissue Sarcoma (other than osteosarcoma, chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's sarcoma, or mesothelioma)
- Ischemic heart disease
- Parkinson's disease

Blue Water Navy

- The Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019, signed into law on June 25, 2019. The law went into effect January 1, 2020.
- Expands "presumption of exposure" to Agent Orange for Veterans who served in the offshore waters of Vietnam.
- "Offshore Waters" serving on a vessel within 12nautical miles seaward from a demarcation line during the timeframe of January 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975.
- Bottom Line BWN Veterans can now receive compensation on a presumptive basis for the 14 Agent Orange-related conditions.

Potential Claims Population

- There are between 420,000 and 560,000 Vietnam-era Veterans who may be considered Blue Water Navy Veterans.
- The table shows the estimated number of BWN claims expected over 10 years.

Blue Water Navy Claims Data

As of November 1, 2020

- Total Claims Received 73K
- Total Claims Completed 37K
- Total Claims Granted Benefits 26K (71%)
- Pay Out Amount = \$700 million
